Operations reports

Waterworks:

- May 8th New hydrant and 2 valves installed on corner of Grant and Ingersol.
- May 9th Village water/wastewater truck got an oil change.
- May 12th Water main capped on 6th Ave project so they could access Sanitary Sewer.
- May 21st Well 2 Standby generator had yearly service with load test. No issues.
- May 16th Our order of 100 new meters (Iperl+) and radios showed up. Talked with the rep from Core & Main, the new meters require a computer update before installation. This will take place in the middle of June. No date set yet.
- New water meter installs on going, "book 3" is almost complete. 37
- May 28th Marble Park pool E. Coli testing started
- 2 High water bill investigations- Both had leaks.
- Submitted monthly DNR report.
- Monthly distribution bacteriological samples were safe.
- All Digger's Hotline locates are up to date. 57

Wastewater:

- May 1- Disinfection season began. Weekly E. Coli test, daily chlorine residual testing.
- May 5th - Cummins NPower preventative maintenance on standby generator, did not do a load test. Will bring their own load-bank to next scheduled maintenance.
- May 16th 13th Ave LS called out at 5:45am. No issues at LS when I arrived. Reset HOA switches. Ended up being a communication error.
- May 20th we had an SSO (Sanitary Sewer Overflow) on 6th Ave. Force main broke open. Jossert dug it up and had it fixed within a few hours.
- May 20th Cory from PJ Kortens went to each lift station with AIT to figure out the network issues.
- May 23rd Fine screen compactor was pulled due to failure. Auger and wear strips were worn down bad, gear box had metal shavings in it. Still waiting on an estimate for repairing and replacing. May have it by this morning.
- Submitted monthly DNR report.
- Preventative maintenance performed on equipment.
- Weekly visual lift station inspections were completed.
- Chlorine tank was leaking chemical through a pin hole. A new 300-gallon tank was installed replacing the 2, 200-gallon tanks. We also reused one of the VEGA radar scales from the old Well 1 setup. We will also be getting a new 200-gallon Bisulfate tank and reusing the other VEGA scale.
